Head of School's Letter

Wow! This week seems to have flown by but I know the children are ready for their weekend! The majority of children have come into school happily this week although there have been one or two tears. For most children, the hardest part is separating from their parent or carer and once they are into school the tears quickly stop. It never ceases to amaze me at how quickly a child can go from being distraught at separating to 5 minutes later playing and chatting happily. As a parent, I know how hard it is seeing your child upset but please be assured, if your child continues to be upset when they are in school, we will let you know. Don't forget that if you need to tell us anything, your child's class teacher should be available at the end of school most days and a member of the senior leadership team should be on the playground every morning.

We always start the year with an arts, PSHE and outdoor focus for the children with lots of free choice time spent on a range of carefully planned activities. This allows us to work on forming positive relationships with each of the children as an individual and enables the children to enjoy getting to know each other without the pressures of academic study. However, we've been amazed at the number of children who have chosen to engage with writing or maths tasks and we've been really impressed with some of the beautiful artwork they have produced. The children have really enjoyed their time outdoors, exploring their outdoor classrooms and our forest school area. It is also great to hear so many of the children talking about the colours and feelings of the 'Zones of Regulation'. We use the Zones of Regulation across the school— there are lots of good parents and carers guides to this available online and I will share some further information about how it works in our school next week.

Does your child want to experience the magic of playing music in their very own band? We've partnered with Rocksteady to deliver in-school rock and pop band lessons, giving children the chance to play music with no experience needed! All instruments provided. 
Assembly Award

LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The Supreme Court has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time (Platt v Isle of Wright 2017). The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

The law states a leave of absence may only be granted by a school if an application is made in advance and if it considers there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application.

Schools must judge each application individually considering the specific facts and circumstances and relevant background context behind each request.

A leave of absence is granted entirely at the school's discretion. Generally, a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance.

Where a leave of absence is granted, the school will determine the number of days a pupil can be absent from school.

When making an application for Leave of Absence parents are advised to give sufficient information and time to allow the Head teacher the opportunity to consider all the exceptional circumstances and to notify parents of their decision. The school may also request further information on the application and supporting documentation where appropriate.

It is advised that if the resident parent has not received notification or a response regarding the leave of absence application, it is the parents' responsibility to ascertain if the leave is authorised prior to the start of the leave.

The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent ie the parent with whom the child normally resides.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child is expected to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Where a leave of absence is requested, but additional days taken either prior to or after the request may be considered as part of the leave of absence.

Leave of Absences which are not made in advance cannot be authorised in line with legislation. This will result in the absence being recorded as 'unauthorised'.

All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Warwickshire Attendance Service, part of Warwickshire County Council. Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices and in the first instance, as an alternative to prosecution proceedings.

Leave of Absence taken in the academic year 2025-26

The law relating to Penalty Notices changed with effect from 19 August 2024. Therefore, Penalty Notices issued for Leave of Absence taken from September 2024 will be issued in accordance with the updated legislation.

Penalty Notices are issued to each parent of each absent child, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means each parent will receive 2 invoices – 4 in total).

First Leave of Absence offence: The Penalty Notice amount of £160 to be paid within 28 days, this is reduced to £80 each child if paid within 21 days.
